
CORPORATE HISTORY

- Commissioned and built by the federal government from 1914-1923 in order to open Alaska to development. Operated by the federal government until 1985.
- The State of Alaska purchased the railroad in 1985 for \$22.3 million, creating the stateowned Alaska Railroad Corporation.
- ARRC is an independent public corporation managed by a seven-member Board of Directors appointed by the Governor of Alaska.
- State law mandates that ARRC must maintain operations and services independent of state budget, and separate responsibility for financial and legal obligations.
- ARRC received 36,000 acres of land in federal transfer, of which roughly half is available for lease at fair market value to support capital expenses.

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

- In 2024, ARRC supported over 250 charitable, civic and community nonprofits with over \$364,000 in event sponsorships and in-kind donations of rail tickets, posters/prints, used ties, and chartered use of the historic Denali Car.
- Since 1981, ARRC has partnered with school districts to offer a hospitality vocational program to train high school students to serve as hosts aboard summer passenger trains.
- ARRC has partnered with Alaskans for Litter Prevention and Recycling supporting backhaul of recyclable materials to the lower 48.
