ALASKA RAILROAD FLAGSTOP SERVICE

The Alaska Railroad's **Aurora Winter Train** travels from Anchorage through the Mat-Su Valley, stopping in the charming town of Talkeetna, and continues onward to the wilderness of Denali National Park before reaching its terminus in the Interior city of Fairbanks. Travelers on this journey traverse the Alaska Range and enjoy stunning views of panoramic vistas, wildlife, river valleys, and rocky gorges. On clear days, travelers may even see an incredible view of Denali, North America's tallest peak.

Travelers may also choose to ride the **Hurricane Turn Train** the first Thursday of each month. The Hurricane Turn travels north from Anchorage past Talkeetna, to the backcountry where passengers may access hunting, skiing and remote cabins - or stay onboard to enjoy the views. Both trains provide flagstop service along the 55-mile stretch north of Talkeetna to Hurricane.

Upon arrival in Talkeetna you'll be met by a representative from Talkeetna Roadhouse, your home for the weekend. The Roadhouse is full of character, warm hospitality, and the delicious smells and flavors of freshly baked goods.

Enjoy a pie-making class with Trisha, the proprietress of the Talkeetna Roadhouse, who has been making pies for 20-some years. Learn the secret of pie crust as she walks you through her technique. Each participant will take home a world-famous Talkeetna Roadhouse pie. After finishing your class, choose dinner at one of the local establishments in Talkeetna.

SUNDAY - The morning is at your leisure; you will have plenty of time to enjoy exploring Talkeetna before you climb aboard the Aurora Winter Train for your scenic and relaxing ride back to Anchorage.

SATURDAY - Take the Aurora Winter Train from Anchorage to Fairbanks for an unforgettable journey across this land of vast mountain ranges and untouched wilderness. Watch for wildlife and, on a clear day, an incredible view of Denali - North America's tallest peak. Overnight in Fairbanks, known for dazzling displays of the aurora borealis.

SUNDAY - Spend the day exploring Interior Alaska's largest city. Opt to visit the excellent Museum of the North. A short flight provides your return to Anchorage.

Or, reverse the itinerary: fly on Saturday, and save the rail journey for Sunday. Travelers originating in Fairbanks may also plan a weekend rail-fly itinerary with an overnight in Anchorage.

Ask about extending your time in Fairbanks to add a guided winter journey across the Arctic Circle.

DENALI IN A DAY

Saturdays, late September 2017 – mid-May 2018
Select midweek dates available.

SATURDAY – Mid-morning, meet your guide in Fairbanks and begin the drive south along the Parks Highway, visiting the river community of Nenana en route to Denali National Park. At Denali, experience the park's six million acres of wilderness as few ever have the chance to see it, savoring the quiet beauty and solitude of a winter landscape blanketed in snow. Explore the Murie Science and Learning Center and learn about the rugged landscape – including Denali's namesake peak, the tallest mountain in North America – and famed wildlife such as bears, moose, caribou, and more. Visit the Denali National Park sled dog yard, home to the last working dog sled team in the National Park Service.

After a full day of exploring Alaska's most iconic National Park, climb aboard the Aurora Winter Train for a relaxing rail journey back to Fairbanks.

INCLUDES: Guided drive from Fairbanks to Denali, visit to Murie Science and Learning Center, visit to Denali National Park sled dog yard, guided nature walk or snowshoe, rail from Denali to Fairbanks.

THE AURORA

3 nights - Interior Alaska
Late September 2017 - late April 2018
Friday through Monday

FRIDAY - Spend the night in Anchorage and opt to visit the Anchorage Museum at Rasmuson Center, the Alaska Aviation Museum or explore downtown shops and galleries. Excellent local dining options are plentiful.

SATURDAY - Travel to Fairbanks by train. Enjoy the serene winter landscapes and watch for wildlife and the northern lights as you travel north. Overnight in Fairbanks.

SUNDAY - Discover Alaska's Arctic with Northern Alaska Tour Company. Fly over the Yukon River Valley, the Arctic Circle and beyond, outside of the Gates of the Arctic National Park. Participate in a ceremonial Arctic Circle crossing. Learn about the Brooks Range and see the Trans Alaska pipeline. Return to Fairbanks and overnight.

Friday through Wednesday



FRIDAY - Arrive in Anchorage. Opt to go flightseeing over the Chugach Range, visit the Anchorage Museum at Rasmuson Center, go cross-country skiing, or enjoy fine dining, shopping and numerous galleries. Overnight in Anchorage.

SATURDAY - Travel to Fairbanks via the Aurora Winter Train. Watch for the northern lights. Stay the night in Fairbanks.

SUNDAY / MONDAY - Depart on the Arctic Circle Aurora Adventure with Northern Alaska Tour Company. Cross the Yukon River and head deep into the Arctic. Spend two nights in the Brooks Range, known for phenomenal northern lights viewing. Ask about optional tours, including a dogsled ride.

TUESDAY - Return to Fairbanks on a scenic flight, crossing the Arctic Circle once more as you travel south. See the vast arctic tundra landscape from the skies. Arrive in Fairbanks and overnight.

WEDNESDAY - Return to Anchorage by air.

SATURDAY - Depart Anchorage on the Aurora Winter Train for a serene journey through Alaska's snow-blanketed Interior. Overnight in Fairbanks.

SUNDAY - Spend the day visiting the 28th annual World Ice Art Championships. Fairbanks hosts the world's largest ice art competition and exhibition, with over 70 teams from all over the world. The competition and the Kids' Ice Art Park attract more than 100 ice artists and approximately 45,000 visitors from Alaska and all over the world. Return to Anchorage Sunday night via air.

(Note: travelers may opt to add an additional night and day to explore Fairbanks. Alternatively, travelers may choose to fly from Anchorage to Fairbanks and then return to Anchorage via train.)

IDITAROD RACE & RONDY TOUR

4 nights - Interior Alaska
February 28, 2018 - March 3, 2018*



The world-famous Iditarod Sled Dog Race starts in Anchorage on **Saturday, March 3**. Fans call it the Last Great Race on Earth. The route covers 1,000 miles of the world's most extreme and beautiful terrain - across mountain ranges, frozen rivers, dense forests, wind-swept tundra and arctic coastline.

WEDNESDAY - Arrive in Anchorage February 28. Overnight.

THURSDAY - Board the Alaska Railroad Hurricane Turn Train, one of America's last flagstop services, for a trip into Alaska's Interior. The round-trip journey travels north from Anchorage to Hurricane Gulch, along the Susitna River and through the Indian River Valley. Overnight back in Anchorage.

FRIDAY - Head to the Fur Rondy, an Anchorage festival tradition dating back to the days when fur

trappers wanted to blow off a little mid-winter steam. Now it's a full-blown winter celebration. Overnight in Anchorage.

SATURDAY - The Iditarod Sled Dog Race starts within walking distance of your hotel. After the last musher leaves the chute, enjoy time to explore downtown Anchorage. Next day, fly home or opt for more activities in the Anchorage area.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

PAYMENT: Full payment is required within 72 hours of booking. We accept VISA, MC, Discover and American Express cards.

LATE BOOKINGS: Package bookings that are made within 35 days of departure require a minimum of 24 hours to confirm availability. Full payment is required at the time of booking.

REFUNDS: All winter vacations that are canceled 36 or more days before travel will be refunded 90% of the booking value. No refunds will be issued 35 or less days before travel. No refunds will be issued for unused services.

Rail-only bookings that are canceled one (1) or more days before travel will be refunded 90% of the booking value. No refunds will be issued the day of travel.

CHANGE FEES: All paid bookings are subject to a 10% change fee. Changes are allowed on packages up to 36 days before travel and on rail-only bookings up to one day prior to travel. A “package” is any rail booking that includes a non-rail component. Change fees apply only to the changed value of the booking. No change fees apply when the change increases the cost of the booking. Changes to packages that include flights may incur additional fees. Any charges incurred by the Alaska Railroad as a result of changes made by the customer will be applied to the booking in addition to the change fee. All changes or cancellations must be made during business hours through the Alaska Railroad Reservations Office at 800.544.0552 or 907.265.2494.

TRAVEL INSURANCE: We strongly recommend that you purchase trip cancellation insurance so you can plan your travel with complete peace of mind. Ask your Alaska Railroad reservations agent for a travel insurance quote and about available plans.

CHECK-IN: Please check in one hour prior to the scheduled departure time. Reservations and seat assignments may be altered or reassigned if passenger(s) and baggage are not checked in 15 minutes prior to scheduled departure. The Transportation Security Administration requires that any Alaska Railroad passenger 18 years of age or older present a government issued photo ID, or two other forms of ID, one of which must be issued by a government authority. Children ages 2-15 may only travel in the company of an adult 18 years or older.

BAGGAGE: Alaska Railroad passengers are allowed four pieces of checked baggage and one carry-on. No single piece may weigh over 50 lbs. A special handling fee of \$20 per bag applies to oversized bags, bicycles, and other recreational equipment. Firearms may be transported only as checked baggage and must be either disassembled (slide or bolt removed) or have a lock (trigger or cable type) installed to prevent operation, and must be in a locked case. Concealed weapons are not permitted onboard.

Passengers may transport five liters or less of white gas per container in the baggage car. Federal Railroad Administration regulations prohibit the transport of all other types of camping stove fuels and/or motor fuels on passenger trains. Non-service animals must be transported in kennels in the baggage car; a special handling fee of \$20 applies. For more information, visit AlaskaRailroad.com/baggage.

SCHEDULES AND FARES: Delays can occur with rail service; the Alaska Railroad recommends a **minimum of six hours** between scheduled rail arrival time and an air departure.
