

WHO WE ARE

The Alaska Railroad Corporation is a full-service railroad serving ports and communities throughout Southcentral and Interior Alaska. Primarily, we serve as regularly scheduled public transportation in these regions – it's been our commitment since 1923.

In summer, the Alaska Railroad provides daily service to many Alaska destinations. Passengers seeking rail-only travel will find schedules and fares beginning on page 9, while travelers seeking to explore Alaska may be interested in our multi-day travel packages (page 21) and day trips (page 39). Whatever your reason for riding the rails, we think you'll agree the views from our tracks are some of the most spectacular on Earth.

WHERE WE GO

The Alaska Railroad travels along approximately 500 miles of track with three daily summer trains: the Coastal Classic to Seward, the Denali Star to Anchorage, Talkeetna, Denali and Fairbanks and the Glacier Discovery to Whittier, Portage, Spencer Glacier Whistle Stop and Grandview. The Hurricane Turn Flagstop Train runs Thursday through Monday out of Talkeetna during the summer, serving remote homes only accessible by rail.

During non-summer months, the Aurora Winter Train provides service between Anchorage and Fairbanks on weekends and select mid-week departures. The Hurricane Turn winter service runs once a month from Anchorage to Hurricane Gulch on the first Thursday of the month.

 This magnificent wall of ice rises into view from our tracks.
 Countless adventure activities await you at Spencer Glacier
 Whistle Stop (see page 45).
- Milepost 224 | ALASKA RANGE
 Here you can see a stunning view of the tallest peak in
 North America, Mount Hunter, Mount Foraker, Mount Russell
 and Mount Dall. This is also home to the confluence of three
 major rivers: Talkeetna, Chulitna and Susitna.
- Milepost 284 | HURRICANE GULCH One of the line's best photo vantage points, the bridge spans 918 feet – 296 feet above the creek.
- Milepost 304 | BROAD PASS
 The lowest pass in the Alaska Range.
- Milepost 313 | SUMMIT
 The summit of the Continental Divide is at 2,363 feet. Summit Lake drains into both the Pacific Ocean and Bering Sea.
- Milepost 348 | DENALI PARK
 This milepost marks the entrance to Denali National Park, home to North America's highest mountain peak.
- > Milepost 414 | MEARS MEMORIAL BRIDGE
 This 700-foot mass of steel is one of the longest single-span
 bridges in the world. Dedicated by President Warren G.
 Harding who in 1923 drove the final (golden) spike it marks
 the completion of the Alaska Railroad. If you look below, you
 can see Athabascan fish wheels in the Tanana River.





Coupon books are valid for discounted adult fares only and may be used for points between Talkeetna and Hurricane Gulch. Adult coupons may be used for child, military or senior fares; or, a separate child, military or senior fare may be purchased instead.



GRANDE ALASKA TOUR

Available late May - early September



DAY 2 - Board the Coastal Classic Train for a breathtaking ride along Turnagain Arm and through scenic Grandview. Upon arrival in **Seward**, explore the charming port community of Seward, Alaska. The Real Alaska Tour promises authentic adventures, including a dog sled ride, lunch at an Alaska roadhouse and a tour to Exit Glacier. Overnight in Seward.

DAY 3 – Today, embark on a cruise of Kenai Fjords National Park in search of glaciers, whales, sea lions and more. The captain ensures you'll stay informed and entertained. That evening, depart for Anchorage on the Coastal Classic Train. Overnight in Anchorage.

DAY 4 - Explore beyond Anchorage's city limits on a guided tour of Knik Glacier, or get an aerial view of Alaska's largest city and the Chugach Mountains on a helicopter tour. Overnight in Anchorage.

DAY 5 – Visit one of the many museums and cultural centers in Anchorage, from the Anchorage Museum to the Alaska Native Heritage Center or opt for a trolley tour of the city. Overnight in Anchorage.

DAY 6 - Ride the train to **Girdwood**, where you'll disembark for a short transfer to the Alaska Wildlife Conservation Center. After seeing brown and black bears, moose, wolves and more, reboard the train for a short ride to the rail-access-only Spencer Glacier Whistle Stop and a guided raft float in full view of the glacier.

DAY 7 - Depart for **Talkeetna** aboard the Denali Star Train. See Denali by air on an Alaska Range flightseeing tour. Overnight at the Talkeetna Alaskan Lodge.

DAY 8 - Try your hand at Alaska's state sport on a guided excursion of dryland dog mushing. Overnight at the Talkeetna Alaskan Lodge.

DAY 9 – Journey to **Denali National Park** aboard the Denali Star Train. Enjoy an evening of rip-roarin' entertainment and a hearty meal at a local dinner theater. Overnight in Denali.

DAY 10 - Embark on a wildlife Denali bus tour with an expert naturalist driver guide. Wildlife sightings are common, so keep your camera handy. Overnight in Denali.

DAY 11 – Get behind the wheel on a guided jeep tour. Later, take the Denali Star Train to **Fairbanks**, known as the Golden Heart City. Overnight in Fairbanks.

DAY 12 – Take a tour on the Riverboat Discovery, a historic sternwheeler, for a glimpse of life in Interior Alaska; see dog sledding, an Alaska Native village and much more. Later that day, travel above the Arctic Circle on a flightseeing tour. Overnight in Fairbanks.

DAY 1 - Arrive in **Fairbanks** and overnight.

DAY 2 – Take the Denali Star, the Alaska Railroad's flagship train with service to **Denali National Park & Preserve**. Watch for views of Denali and keep an eye out for wildlife. Later, enjoy an evening of rip-roarin' entertainment and hearty grub at a local dinner theater. Overnight in Denali.

DAY 3 – Enjoy a half-day narrated bus tour along the Denali Park Road. Your guide will highlight the history, flora and fauna of the area as you make your way to East Fork River, taking in the stunning views of the Alaska Range. Overnight in Denali.

DAY 4 - The morning is at your leisure before your journey to Anchorage on the Denali Star Train. Overnight in Anchorage.

Optional Denali Add-on: River rafting on Nenana River (see page 55).

DAY 5 - See wild Alaska brown bears in their natural habitat of Chinitna Bay on a fly-out bear viewing excursion. Overnight in Anchorage.

DAY 6 - Travel via the Glacier Discovery Train to the Spencer Glacier Whistle Stop. Float among the icebergs at Spencer Glacier and down the Placer River. A short train ride to **Portage** follows the float tour, and a motorcoach transfer from Portage to Anchorage gets you back in time for dinner. Overnight in Anchorage.

DAY 7 - Take the Coastal Classic Train to Seward. Upon arrival, board a boat for a wildlife and glacier cruise, watching for glaciers, sea otters, sea lions and perhaps even a whale. Lunch included. Evening train departure from **Seward** to Anchorage. Overnight in Anchorage.

DAY 1 - Arrive in **Anchorage** and overnight. Plan to arrive early to explore Alaska's largest city and to get a good night's sleep before tomorrow's rail journey.

DAY 2 - Ride the Glacier Discovery Train for a full day's adventure. First, enjoy the views of Turnagain Arm before disembarking for a guided tour of the Alaska Wildlife Conservation Center. Reboard the train for your next destination: the **Spencer Glacier Whistle Stop**. Here, raft among glacial icebergs and float down the scenic Placer River before hopping aboard a motorcoach to Anchorage. Overnight in Anchorage.

DAY 3 - Depart early on the Coastal Classic Train to **Seward**. Upon arrival, hop on a boat for a glacier and wildlife cruise. See hanging and tidewater glaciers, sea otters, sea lions and perhaps even a gray or humpback whale. Lunch included. Overnight in Seward.

DAY 4 - After a leisurely morning, spend the afternoon on the Real Alaska Tour. This includes **Exit Glacier**, lunch at an Alaska roadhouse and a dog sled ride. Evening departure to Anchorage on the Coastal Classic Train. Overnight in Anchorage.

DAY 5 - Travel north to **Denali National Park** via the Denali Star Train. Enjoy a hearty meal and rip-roarin' entertainment at a local dinner theater. Overnight in Denali.



CHANGE FEES: All paid bookings are subject to a 10% change fee. Changes are allowed on packages up to 36 days before travel and on rail-only bookings up to 24 hours prior to travel. A "package" is any rail booking that includes a non-rail component. Change fees apply only to the changed value of the booking. No change fees apply when the change increases the cost of the booking. Changes to packages that include airline flights or the Denali Backcountry Lodge, Kenai Fjords Wilderness Lodge or Kenai Fjords Glacier Lodge may incur additional fees. Any charges incurred by the Alaska Railroad as a result of changes made by the customer will be applied to the booking in addition to the change fee. All changes or cancellations must be made during business hours through the Alaska Railroad Reservations office at 800.544.0552 or 907.265.2494.

TRAVEL INSURANCE: We strongly recommend that you purchase trip cancellation insurance so you can plan your travel with complete peace of mind. Ask your Alaska Railroad reservations agent for a travel insurance quote and about the available plans.

CHECK-IN: Plan to check in one hour prior to the scheduled departure time. Reservations and seat assignments may be altered or reassigned if passenger and baggage are not checked in 15 minutes prior to scheduled departure. The Transportation Security Administration requires that any Alaska Railroad passenger 18 years of age or older present a government-issued photo ID, or two forms of ID, one of which must be issued by a government authority. Children under the age of 16 may only travel in the company of an adult 18 years or older.

BAGGAGE: Alaska Railroad passengers are allowed two pieces of checked baggage and one carry-on. Two extra pieces of baggage (for a total of four) may be checked for an additional fee of \$20 per bag. No single piece may weigh over 50 lbs. A special handling fee of \$20 per bag applies to oversized bags, bicycles, animals checked in the baggage car and other recreational equipment. Firearms may be transported only as checked baggage and must be either disassembled (slide or bolt removed) or have a lock (trigger or cable type) installed to prevent operation, and must be in a locked case. Concealed weapons are not permitted onboard. The Federal Railroad Administration prohibits the transport of fuel, other than five liters or less of white gas per container in the baggage car; kerosene and propane may be transported on the Glacier Discovery Train but must be checked with conductor at time of boarding. Non-service animals must be transported in kennels in the baggage car. All passengers, baggage and shipments may be subject to inspection. Visit AlaskaRailroad.com/Baggage for more information.

SCHEDULES AND FARES: Delays can occur with rail service; the Alaska Railroad recommends a **minimum of six hours** between scheduled rail arrival time and an air departure. The Alaska Railroad will not be responsible for missed connections. Schedules and prices are subject to change without notice.

As a provider of regularly scheduled public transportation, the Alaska Railroad offers a 20% discount on published retail rail fares to active-duty and retired members of the U.S. military. The Alaska Railroad Corporation offers a Half-Fare Program for Seniors (65+), Medicare cardholders and individuals with certain disabilities, allowing them to travel for half-fare during the Alaska Railroad's winter service.

ALTERNATE TRANSPORTATION: The Alaska Railroad will provide the best alternate service available in the event of unforeseen circumstances that may require any part of our service to be altered.

ACCESSIBILITY: We are pleased to provide wheelchair lifts at all stations. Accessibility on other connecting modes of transport can vary, so please check with an agent for details. Alaska Railroad's passenger trains are wheelchair accessible and comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act. Service animals are welcome aboard.
