REQUEST FOR INTEREST (RFI) 22-44-RFI ARRC CANCER PATIENT SUPPORT SERVICES

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Alaska Railroad Corporation (ARRC) is a public corporation and instrumentality of the State of Alaska formed pursuant to AS 42.40 and is the last full service (passengers and freight) railroad in the United States, with a route that runs from Seward and Whittier at tidewater to the interior of Alaska just beyond Fairbanks. The corporate headquarters are in Anchorage. ARRC averages approximately 680 employees (year-round and seasonal), with employment reaching 750 in the summer season. Seventy-five percent (75%) of ARRC employees are represented by one of five (5) unions: Alaska Railroad Workers (ARW), American Train Dispatchers (ADTA), International Brotherhood of Teamsters (IBT), Transportation Communications Union (TCU), and the United Transportation Union (UTU). The remaining employees are non-represented and management personnel. The railroad bargains benefit matters with all five labor organizations.

As ARRC is a public corporation of the State of Alaska, its benefit plans are governmental plans and not subject to ERISA provisions. More information about ARRC may be found at www.alaskarailroad.com.

BACKGROUND

ARRC is looking for a firm that can help us improve the quality of life for cancer patients (employees and families) during and after their cancer treatment by bridging gaps in the medical system. Our goal is to transform cancer care by connecting cancer patients with a firm with inhouse care coordinators, nurse navigators, cancer coaches, symptom management specialists, and other value-based care services.

ARRC has about 1400 members on the health plan and in 2021 ARRC had about 22 members with a cancer diagnosis.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

An entirely integrated in-house services to include:

- Professional RN Nurse Navigators with oncology-specific clinical knowledge who can offer individualized assistance to patients, families, and caregivers to help overcome healthcare system barriers.
- Professional Benefits Advisors who will help cancer patients understand ARRC's group health plan, how the plan covers the treatment of their diagnosis, and payment of services.

- Customer Service Staff who partner directly with licensed counselors to ensure every cancer patient is supported fully throughout their treatment.
- A Survivorship Program that will help cancer survivors manage the physical and emotional changes they experience after their cancer treatment is completed.
- An Oncology Care Management program with provider relationships in Anchorage Alaska, and Fairbanks Alaska.
