APPENDIX A

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Items to be purchased through this solicitation are important to the operation of the ARRC. Vendors who respond to this solicitation must meet the following minimum qualifications in order to be considered responsive:

- 1. Be the original manufacturer, or a distributor/dealer authorized by the original manufacturer to serve the State of Alaska; and
- 2. Has the authority and capacity to provide full support for all product warranties, including technical "trouble shooting" support; and
- 3. Be able to provide audited financial statements demonstrating the financial ability to meet the requirements of any order that may result from this solicitation if asked to do so.

1. ALASKA BIDDER PREFERENCE: Award will be made to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder after an Alaska bidder preference of five percent (5%) has been applied. The preference will be given to a person who: (1) holds a current Alaska business license at the time designated in the invitation to bid for bid opening; (2) submits a bid for goods or services under the name on the Alaska business license; (3) has maintained a place of business within the state staffed by the bidder, or an employee of the bidder, for a period of six months immediately preceding the date of the bid; (4) is incorporated or qualified to do business under the laws of the state, is a sole proprietorship and the proprietor is a resident of the state, is a limited liability company organized under AS 10.50 and all members are residents of the state; and, (5) if a joint venture, is composed entirely of ventures that qualify under (1) - (4) of this subsection.

2. ALASKA VETERAN PREFERENCE: If a bidder qualifies for the Alaska bidder preference and is a qualifying entity as defined herein, they will be awarded an Alaska veteran preference of five percent (5%). The preference will be given to a (1) sole proprietorship owned by an Alaska veteran; (2) partnership under AS 32.06 or AS 32.11 if a majority of the partners are Alaska veterans; (3) limited liability company organized under AS 10.50 if a majority of the members are Alaska veterans; or (4) corporation that is wholly owned by individuals and a majority of the individuals are Alaska veterans, and may not exceed \$5,000. The bidder must also add value by actually performing, controlling, managing, and supervising the services provided, or for supplies, the bidder must have sold supplies of the general nature solicited to other state agencies, other governments, or the general public.

In order to receive the Alaska Bidder Preference and/or Alaskan Veteran Preference, the bid must also include a statement certifying that the bidder is eligible to receive said preferences. The application of preferences is for bid evaluation purposes only.

APPENDIX B

STANDARD INSTRUCTIONS AND CONDITIONS FOR THE SUBMISSION OF BIDS TO THE ALASKA RAILROAD CORPORATION

1. Method of Bidding

Bids must be submitted in the spaces provided on the bid sheets of this invitation in accordance with the conditions of bid as stated herein. The bid will not be considered to be complete unless all spaces have been filled in. Consideration for award will be provided to complete bids only. If a Bidder wishes to supply additional information, it may be included along with the bid in the sealed bid envelope.

2. Bidder's Terms and Conditions: Prospective bidders are cautioned to pay particular attention to this clause.

Bidder/Contractor imposed terms and conditions which conflict with this Invitation to Bid terms and conditions are considered counter offers and, as such, will cause the Alaska Railroad Corporation to consider the bid non-responsive.

If a Bidder attaches additional terms and conditions as part of the bid, such attachments must be accompanied by a disclaimer stating that in the event of conflict between the terms and conditions of this Invitation to Bid and the terms and conditions of the Bidder/Contractor, the terms and conditions of the Invitation to Bid will prevail.

3. Amendments

The ARRC procurement officer will attempt to notify all who are known to have received the solicitation documents if any amendments are issued, but it shall be the bidder's responsibility to ascertain prior to submitting a bid that he/she has received all amendments issued.

4. Submission of Bids

4.1 Interested vendors shall submit an original and one copy of their bids in sealed envelopes or packages (1) addressed to the office specified in the solicitation and (2) showing the time specified for receipt, the solicitation number, and the name and address of the bidder. Bids must be received by ARRC no later than the local time at the place and on the date set for receipt of bids in the solicitation.

4.2 Any required samples must be submitted within the time specified for receipt of bids. Unless otherwise specified in the solicitation, these samples shall be (1) submitted at no expense to the ARRC and (2) returned only upon the sender's request and at their expense.

4.3 ARRC may postpone the date and time announced for receipt of bids. Such postponement may be made at any time prior to the established date and time for receipt of bids by notice and addendum to the solicitation to all known potential bidders.

5. Explanation to Prospective Bidders

Bidders shall promptly notify ARRC of any ambiguity, inconsistency, conflict, or error which they may discover upon examination of the solicitation documents. All inquiries regarding a solicitation shall be directed to the ARRC representative specified in the solicitation. Any prospective bidder desiring an explanation or interpretation of the solicitation, drawings, specifications, etc., must request it in writing soon enough to allow a reply to reach all prospective bidders before the submission of their bid. To facilitate the exchange of information, vendors' questions regarding a solicitation may be communicated by telephone, and then confirmed in writing. Oral explanations or instructions given before award of the contract will not be binding.

instructions given to a prospective bidder concerning a solicitation will be furnished promptly to all other prospective bidders as an amendment to the solicitation, if in the opinion of ARRC, such information is deemed necessary to submit bids or if the lack of it would be prejudicial to other prospective bidders

6. Late Submissions, Modifications, and Withdrawals of Bids/Proposals

6.1 Any bid received at the office designated in the solicitation after the exact time specified for receipt will not be considered unless the delay was due to an ARRC error.

6.2 The only acceptable evidence to establish the time of receipt at the ARRC is the time/date stamp of ARRC's Procurement Office on the bid wrapper or other documentary evidence of receipt maintained by ARRC.

6.3 Correction, modification, or withdrawal of bids will be allowed only as stated in ARRC Procurement Rule 1200.8.

7. Preparation of Bids/Proposals

7.1 Bidders are expected to carefully examine the solicitation documents including all drawings, specifications, schedules, terms and conditions, and all instructions. Failure to do so will be at the bidder's risk. Incomplete bids may be rejected as nonresponsive.

7.2 Each bidder shall furnish all information required by the solicitation. An officer or other official of the vendor's company who has legal authority to commit the vendor to the contract proposed must sign the bid. The person signing the bid must initial erasures or other changes.

7.3 Bids for supplies or services other than those specified, or bids conditioned upon receiving award of all or a portion of the contract shall be deemed nonresponsive and shall be rejected unless authorized by the solicitation.

7.4 Time, if stated as a number of days, will include Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays.

8. Evaluation of Bids and Contract Award

ARRC shall review and evaluate each submission in accordance with the criteria established in the solicitation and ARRC's Procurement Rules. In addition to other factors, bids will be evaluated on the basis of advantages and disadvantages to ARRC that might result from making more than one award (multiple awards).

9. Reservations

In addition to other rights in the solicitation, ARRC reserves, holds and may exercise at its sole discretion, the following rights and options:

9.1 ARRC may reject any or all bids, or any part thereof, and may waive technicalities and minor informalities if such action is deemed to be in its best interest. ARRC also may reject the bid of any vendor who has previously failed to perform adequately under a prior contract for furnishing supplies/services to ARRC.

9.2 If an award is made and, prior to entering into a contract, subsequent information indicates that such award was not in the best interest of ARRC, ARRC may rescind the award without prior notice to bidders and either award to another bidder or reject all bids.

9.3 ARRC may cancel any contract, if in its opinion the vendor fails at any time to perform adequately, or if there is any attempt to willfully impose goods/services upon ARRC which are, in ARRC's opinion, of an unacceptable quality. Any action taken pursuant to this latter stipulation

shall not affect or impair any rights or claim of ARRC to damages for breach of any covenants of the contract by the vendor.

9.4 If the vendor fails to furnish any item or to complete the required work included in the contract, ARRC may withdraw such items or required work from the operation of the contract without incurring further liability.

9.5 ARRC may accept any item or group of items of a bid unless the bidder qualifies the bid by specific limitation.

9.6 ARRC may make an award on any item or quantities less than the quantity offered, at the unit cost or prices offered, unless the bidder specifies otherwise.

9.7 ARRC may supplement, amend, or otherwise modify or cancel this solicitation with or without substitution of another solicitation.

9.8 ARRC may conduct investigations of the bidders and their bids and request additional evidence or documentation to support the information included in any bid.

10. Aggrieved Bidder

An aggrieved bidder may protest an ARRC procurement action by filing a written protest with the procurement officer in accordance with the procedures and time limits specified in ARRC Procurement Rules 1800.1-1800.11.

11. Incurred Costs

The issuance of a solicitation does not obligate ARRC to pay for any bid preparation costs incurred by bidders and does not obligate ARRC to award a contract for supplies/services. All costs incurred as a result of a solicitation or contract negotiations resulting from a solicitation, including travel and personal expenses, are the sole responsibility of the bidder.

12. Availability of Funds

The ARRC's obligation under any contract is contingent upon the availability of funds to pay for contract purchases. No legal liability on the part of ARRC may arise until funds are made available for a contract and until the Contractor receives written notice of such availability from the procurement officer. Signature by an authorized ARRC representative on the contract award document constitutes written notice of availability of funds.

13. Public Information

All submitted bids will be considered confidential until notice of intent to award is issued. After notice of intent to award is issued, all bids will become public information.

14. Price

ARRC shall receive the benefit of any general reduction in bidder's price prior to the delivery of supplies or services and in no event shall ARRC be charged higher prices than bidder's similar customers who purchase substantially similar supplies or services under substantially similar circumstances. All prices bid shall be exclusive of any federal, state, or local taxes from which ARRC is exempt.

APPENDIX C SPECIFICATIONS

SPECIFICATION Traveling Axle Equipment Trailer 5th Wheel Gooseneck with Hydraulic Traveling Axles Minimum 110,000 Pound Capacity

GENERAL SPECIFICATION:

- It is the purpose of this specification to describe a new, and of the manufacturer's latest current model and design,
- minimum 110,000 pound capacity, hydraulic traveling 3 axles, 5th wheel hitch equipment trailer, with winch. Unit to
- include all standard equipment and accessories as advertised in manufacturer's brochure and specification sheet of
- model offered, unless otherwise specified herein.

APPLICATION:

- This unit will be hauling heavy equipment and attachments with operating weights of up to 75,000 pounds. Unit will
- be subject to varying terrain and weather conditions to minus 60 degrees Fahrenheit.

DOCUMENTATION REQUIRED:

• A basic manufacturer's product brochure and specifications describing the unit being bid is to be provided.

TYPICAL UNITS:

• LANDOLL model 455B-53 or approved equal; provided all of the following specifications are met. Any other manufactures brand and model offered must be pre-approved prior to bid submittal.

MINIMUM PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum safety factor of two (2) to one (1) with 80,000 PSI high yield strength flanges and 80,000 to
- 100,000 PSI high yield strength through out.
- Trailer to be capable of carrying maximum GVW at 55 MPH.
- Must be capable of carrying a load center concentration of 70,000 pounds minimum within any 10 foot section of the main deck.
- Axle hydraulic rod cylinder rods to be heated treated, nickel base with chrome plating.
- Tilt deck hydraulic cylinder rods to be chrome plated and in protected (retracted) position when in travel position.

DECK:

- Main Deck:
- Single dropped deck to be level with no openings over tires.
- Width: 120 inches.
- Height: Maximum 40 inches at rear, light.
- Length: Minimum main deck length of 43 foot.
- Load Angle: Maximum seven (7) degrees, accomplished by use of a hydraulic traveling axle system and hydraulic tilting goose neck. The approach lip is not to exceed two (2) inches in height.
- Main deck, when angled, forms a ramp to the upper deck/gooseneck.

• Apitong Hardwood on main deck as listed in OEM trailer manufacture brochure, longitudinal with a minimum1 3/8-inch nominal thickness.

Gooseneck:

- Same width as main deck with approximately nine (9) foot of length.
- Kingpin, with a setting of minimum 16 inches from the front of the trailer.
- Kingpin plate to be hinged and be minimum ½- inch thick, 80,000 yield material.
- Swing Clearance: 80 inches minimum.
- Fifth (5th) Wheel Height: 48 inches.
- Hardwood on main deck as listed in OEM trailer manufacture brochure, longitudinal with a minimum 1 3/8-inch nominal thickness.
- Tool Box: Twin Upper Deck Mounted with Lockable Door (7"H x 34"W x 29"D)

Winch:

• Hydraulic driven, minimum 30,000 pound capacity. With air release and 2 speed function.

Cable and Chain:

- Cable to be 85 foot in length x 5/8 (0.625) inch diameter Flex-x9 wire rope. The end of the cable shall be equipped with three (3) foot length of grade 80, 5/8 (0.625) inch lead chain and chain hook. The chain shall be attached to the cable by a 5/8 "swivel chain connector.
- To include "Free Wheel" capability.
- To include cable roller guide.
- Wireless remote
- Winch guard

Lash Rings:

- Heavy-duty (HD) angled "D" rings, mounted on outer side beam.
- Gooseneck to have two (2) on each side.
- Main deck, starting at two (2) foot from the front, to be spaced about every four (4) Foot, each side.
- Double key hole chain slots with stake pockets, on 16" centers on outer frame rails
- 3/8" x 3" flat rub rails , both sides, upper and lower deck

FRAME and CHASSIS:

- Four beam main frame construction.
- Cross Members: maximum distance of 12 inch centers.
- Air Ride Suspension: HENDRICKSON-TURNER or RIDEWELL, or NEWAY underslung. To include dump valve.

Hydraulics:

- Hydraulic power will be supplied from the State provided host truck's hydraulics. 2500 PSI with 20 GPM
- Hydraulic hook ups shall include quick couplers. The location for the hook ups shall be at the front of the gooseneck with the electrical and air connections.
- Hydraulic valve block to have flow control valve to prevent over pressurization of system.
- Hydraulics shall control:
- Cylinders to raise and lower the main deck to the goose neck.
- Cylinder(s) to slide trailer wheel assembly fore and aft.

Winch.

- Control station, shall be wireless.
- REX ROTH safety valves on cylinders.
- To include 6 way wireless remote pendent

Axles:

- Equipped with air ride suspension
- Oil bath type.
- To have three (3) axles with dual wheels with a minimum of 22,500 pound capacity per axle.
- Axle Spread: 60 inch minimum.
- Oil seals to be low temperature, STEMCO or equivalent.
- Axle slide/travel to be on steel rollers.
- Axles to lock into pockets for transport.
- Tires and Wheels:
- To be steel belted radials 235/75R17.5 (Double coin tires on steel wheels), load capacity to carry the maximum GAWR rating of trailer.

Wheels:

17.5 steel, 10-hole hub piloted disc wheels.

Brakes:

- ABS with 4-sensors and 2-modulators, full air, 16.5 x 7 inch. S-Cam, automatic slack adjusters, and spring brakes on all axles.
- To include arctic type hoses (AEROQUIP or GATES).
- All axles to have maxi cans.
- Standard glad hands, plastic are not acceptable.
- To include safety breakaway valve, automatically applying, in the event of line breakage or low air pressure.
- Any air tanks are to include bleeder valves (automatic or manual), located in protected areas.
- Jack Stands: Dual, hand crank two (2) speed, 100,000 pound minimum total capacity.
- Mud flaps, HD rubber.

ELECTRICAL:

- Grouped Wire harness(s), air hoses and hydraulic lines, that supply under carriage, to be in heavy plastic flex chain with individually changeable links
- Electrical connection (for trailer lighting and the ABS system) to be a seven (7) pole POLLACK #11-724 split pin poly/glass socket with a POLLACK #11-761 socket boot, or PHILLIPS'/ GROTE equivalents.
- Wire position #1, white, 10-gauge, for ground.
- Wire position #2, black, 12-gauge for clearance, side marker, and identification lamps.
- Wire position #3, yellow, 12-gauge, for left turn.
- Wire position #4, red, 12-gauge, for stop lights.
- Wire position #5, green, 12-gauge, for right turn.
- Wire position #6, brown, 12-gauge, for tail and license plate.
- Wire position #7, blue, 12-gauge, for ABS power.

Chassis to trailer power:

- To include a POLLACK #15-212 coiled cord that has the POLLACK #11-910 Weather beater
- poly/glass plugs with cable guards on both ends and is approximately 8 foot in length or equivalent .

- Weight: The total unladen weight, as specified herein, is not to exceed 27,000 pounds.
